SMS is a new company located in Osceola, Arkansas. The new steel mill requires equipment to be serviced regularly. Part of that service includes cutting solidified steel from equipment, to include rollers, so they can be re-manufactured as working parts.

SMS has a group of individuals that will need to be able to use a torch properly to make these repairs without damaging costly equipment. Part of the training will be how to operate equipment safely.

Brent Carroll, ANC's Certified Welding Educator/Certified

Welding Inspector, traveled to Osceola to train SMS employees on-site. The training will occur in several five hour sessions. It will include hands on application with the equipment at SMS.

SMS utilized the Great River Economic Development Foundation and the new Office of Skills Development grant to help fund this training.

Topics for Torch Training include:


- Introduction to Cutting Fuels


