Practical Nursing Virtual Dementia Tour

As part of the course Care of the Geriatric Patient, the practical nursing faculty created an interactive learning experience in which the students were able to experience for themselves some of the mental and physical challenges that elderly dementia persons encounter. The goal of the tour was to help students better understand what it feels like to be a part of the geriatric population with dementia and to hopefully improve the patient-centered care they provide.

This was inspired by a tour the Area Agency on Aging put into place for the Practical Nursing students in 2018 as well as many healthcare facilities in the surrounding area. Many of the students came to class dressed as an elderly person, using assistive devices such as walkers and even with gray hair and wrinkles.

All students were outfitted by faculty with sensory and motor devices/props to alter their senses and abilities.

The students wanted to help contribute to a program they learned about while doing their maternal clinical rotation. 
