ANC Institutional Learning Outcomes Rubric Meeting

On April 7th, twenty-five faculty members evaluated the rubric adopted to assess students' levels of critical thinking. Critical thinking is one of the five broad categories of knowledge and skills (Institutional Learning Outcomes) the college believes every student who receives a degree from the institution should possess in order to succeed in their academic and career paths. These work sessions are being conducted on each of the five rubrics developed to assess the ILOs. During these sessions, faculty apply the rubric to examples of student work from various disciplines. These exercises provide the opportunity to evaluate the specific skills listed in each of the ILOs and determine if the selected key performance indicator (KPI) of student learning measures those skills. After faculty members rate the student's level of performance on each of the five criteria, the ratings are compared and discussed. This helps to ensure that all faculty evaluate student work consistently and in alignment with the ILO scoring rubric.

ANC STUDENT RECEIVES TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIP

Arkansas Northeastern College student Chris Caveney has received the Presidential Transfer Scholarship to Arkansas Tech University. This offer came as a result of both Mr. Caveney's outstanding academic achievements and a recommendation by ANC President Dr. James Shemwell.

The Arkansas Tech University Presidential Transfer Scholarship allows each Arkansas two-year president/chancellor the opportunity to name one student each fall and spring for a transfer scholarship that pays \$3,000 a semester and is renewable for up to five semesters or completion of an undergraduate degree, whichever comes first.

Mr. Caveney is a member and officer in ANC's Gamma Beta Phi Honor Society. Because of his academic excellence and his desire to further his education at Arkansas Tech University, Dr. Shemwell proudly submitted his name as a candidate for the transfer scholarship. Mr. Caveney will transfer following this spring semester at Arkansas Northeastern College.




Tech Center Students Place at SkillsUSA






Energy Wins Awards


